

School Uniform





Autumn 2 Learning



Kingfisher Hall Learning Grid: Autumn Term 2, Nursery Winter

Force for positive change:

Children will discuss why birds migrate in the winter. They will make bird feeders using a variety of materials. They will also use this opportunity to observe different species of birds up close, which will encourage them to care for their natural environment

Communication and Language

This term we will enjoy listening to longer stories and recall much of what happens. The children will talk about people and objects that are important to them. We will build a rich vocabulary listening to a variety of stories, whilst the children share ideas and create their own stories. We will encourage children to listen to each other's suggestions.



Personal, Social-Emotional Development

This term through Jigsaw, we will celebrate our differences. We will talk about our own abilities: what we can do, and what we're still learning to do during circle time. We will develop our confidence in making new friends. We will learn about following the rules, and understanding why they are important.



Physical Development

Our focus this term is encouraging the children to use one-handed tools and equipment e.g. paint brushes and scissors. We will become more independent putting coats on and doing up zips. We will continue to develop our movement: balancing, climbing, and ball skills. We will be practising mark-making and giving meaning to the marks we make.



Literacy

We will start off the term by reading: Gruffalo's Child, Blue Penguin and What can you See in Winter? linking it to our topic. We will engage in extended conversations about stories and learn new vocabulary. We will spot and join in with the repeated refrains in books. We will enjoy retelling the events of the story using pictures and story language.







Maths

Our focus this term will be recognising numbers 1-4 and matching them to the correct group of objects. We will also be using 'Number Blocks' to support our understanding of the composition of numbers up to 4. Children will be exploring 2D shapes by going on a shape hunt and identifying objects with different shapes in the environment, using mathematical language: sides, corners, straight, flat, and round.





Expressive Art and Design

Linking to our Topic 'Winter', the children will create a winter picture. The children will talk about what they see using a wide range of vocabulary. Children will be encouraged to choose their own materials, tools and techniques experimenting with colour, design and texture. They will be encouraged to talk about their creation and the process they have used.



Understanding the World

This term we will continue to develop positive attitudes about the differences between people. The children will use all their senses in the hands-on exploration of natural materials. We will investigate and describe how materials change. We will discuss why people celebrate Christmas. Children will observe seasonal changes, weather patterns and animal behaviour linking to our topic this term.

Attendance and Punctuality

- We believe that regular attendance is clearly linked to pupils making good progress in their learning.
- It ensures that pupils settle into school and experience the stability and security they need in order to achieve their best.
- At a minimum we expect children to be in school for 96% of the time. This can still equate to 8 days of learning missed.
- If your child's attendance drops down to below 90%, this means almost 4 weeks of lost learning!
