Maths



Children will be investigating addition and subtraction within 50 and 100. They will be using manipulatives such as counters and cubes to gain a visual understanding. They will move

onto fractions finding half and a quarter of a shape or quantity. Children will be grouping a variety of objects to show multiplication. Children will also be learning about geometry exploring 2D and 3D shapes.

English



Children will be exploring the text 'The Extraordinary Gardener'. They will write a simple

narrative using a five-sentence story structure. Children will write a explanation text about plants using their knowledge across the curriculum. Through guided reading and phonics sessions (Read, Write, Inc), they will continue to develop their phonic skills.

RE: Sanatana Dharma (Hinduism)

Children will be looking at Sanatana Dharma and why Krishna is important. They will listen to stories of Krishna and explore the Holi festival and why this is also important.

Science: Plants

Children will be learning about basic plant structures, trees, and flowering plants. Children will be visiting Forty Hall to support their science learning. Children will identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. They will also look at and describe the basic structure of these.

PHSE: Healthy Me



This term, children will be discussing exercising bodies, physical activities, healthy food, keeping clean, sleep and safety.

Physical Education




This term children will be exploring patterns and pathways through traditional English dance.
