It has been another very busy week for the children with lots of fantastic activities and learning across the school.

As many parents will know, we currently have a number of staff absent from the school for a variety of reasons. All schools will experience this from time to time. Fortunately, I have been able to recruit some very experienced staff to provide cover. I want parents to know that these qualified teachers have regular guidance and meetings with myself and my senior team to ensure the children are receiving the best possible learning in the event of an absence. I also met this week with the Chief Executive of the Trust which manages our school. We have agreed a plan to recruit new teachers where we need to in order to resolve the situation as quickly as possible. I will keep you updated.

Hundreds of new books for the school.

We are investing £8000] in new books because it is critical that we continue to improve reading across the school. These have now been ordered and will be with us in the New Year. We will be holding special themed open days for parents to come in and use the new libraries with their children.

Please also read at home with your child. Our Read Aloud campaign suggests 15 minutes, every day. All the research shows that children who regularly read do better in all subjects, including maths.

Breakfast Club

We have a wonderful club for the children. If any parents are interested in their child attending in future, I will be dropping into Breakfast Club on Thursday (7.30-8am) and am happy to talk to you.

Celebrating children's work

I am creating a special page on our website to celebrate some of the great work our children do. Each week we will feature a child and a piece of their work.

Lunchtime procedures and rules.

I will be writing next week to all parents and carers. The behaviour of some children needs to improve and I will be

asking for your support for us to achieve this. We will have updated systems in place for lunchtimes and these will be sent out so you can discuss with your child. Thank you.
