

Dear Parents/ Carers

I am always so proud of our amazing children and their achievements but recently there has been some children who are no longer following the school rules consistently. Any disruptive behaviour displayed by a child not only hinders their own progress but also that of their peers. This is not acceptable.

I firmly believe that all children need nurturing and mistakes are made once or twice; we learn from them. I also believe that we should have rules that children follow in order for the school to be a safe and happy place. All children deserve this.

We expect our children to be respectful and courteous and apply themselves to their learning in class. We expect our children to walk calmly and quietly around the school.

Our behaviour expectations are simple:

**Do as you are asked at the first time of asking. Put 100% effort into your learning**

If your child does not follow these rules, then you will be notified by letter on the same day. This is so you are kept informed and you can support the school by discussing the incident with your child.

We base our behaviour policy on praise and implicit reward as you can see in the attached flow chart. Children are reminded to behave in the correct way and get rewarded with bronze, silver or gold cards and then a superstar text home. Negative behaviour is dealt with as illustrated on the flow chart. Unless they have to attend a reflection group, ***children always have the opportunity to rectify any mistakes they make.***

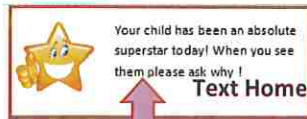
We also have weekly Headteacher's Award Assemblies during which we celebrate commendable behaviour.

***Please note that children are NOT to bring in pencil cases to school.*** They are proving to be a serious distraction in lessons. The school will provide the children with all they need. The pupils must only bring in their book bags or rucksacks with their reading books and homework
