Maths



Children will be exploring the following this term:

- Number – Place Value
- Number – Addition & Subtraction
- Number – Multiplication & Division
- Geometry – 2D Shapes

Children will continue to develop their problem-solving skills through investigations.

English:

In English, children will be reading *Who Let the Gods Out* by Maz Evans. The children will be using this text during their daily reading sessions as well as using this as a stimulus for writing. The writing genres that the children will be focussing on this term will be: fiction- diary, non-fiction- persuasive and formal letter.



Music

In music, year 4 will explore different genres of music from and across Europe. They will also learn some songs and instrumental parts for these songs.



ART: Sculpture



This term the children will look at a variety of Greek vases (Greyson Perry and Roberto Benavines) and develop their ideas of colour, shape, design. They will use practical skills and techniques to make their own inspired Greek Pots, made from clay, depicting aspects of their life and images of their families

Use a wide range of throwing, catching and hitting skills, on both sides of their body with accuracy and consistency.



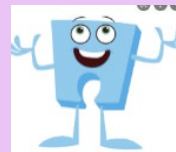
Outdoor:
