Maths: Children will be consolidating their knowledge on number and place value. In addition, children will be looking at the four operations in more detail as well as exploring 2D and 3D shapes. 	English: This term, children will be reading ‘There is a Boy in the Girls’ Bathroom’ by Louis Sachar. They will be using this book as a stimulus for writing a diary entry. They will also be writing a non-chronological report about the Anglo-Saxons, which we will be learning about as part of our History lessons and Learning Journey. They will focus on a range of grammar skills, including conjunctions, adverbials and using a range of punctuation. 	Science: Properties of Materials.  Pupils will explore and group materials based on their properties. Pupils will work scientifically to answer questions about the different properties of materials. Pupils will develop skills in planning a fair test, recording observations and drawing conclusions.	History: Anglo-Saxons and Scots  Children will learn about the position of Britain after the Romans left. This will include who the Anglo-Saxons were, where in Britain they settled and why they settled here. Children will also look at how the Anglo-Saxons fought amongst themselves for power. In addition, we will be looking at how the Anglo-Saxons influenced Britain today. During their learning, children will be able to describe key historical figures in addition to exploring how historians use evidence to understand the past.
PHSE: Being Me in My World  Pupils will explore how their choices have an impact on others. This includes their rights, responsibilities, rewards and consequences within our school and community. As well as this, children will learn how to deal with worries and anxieties and develop an understanding about the importance to being determined to succeed.	Physical Education:  Indoor: Dance Children will work to create movement using improvisation to select and choreograph ideas into a sequence. They will work to move their bodies with control and balance ensuring their sequences are dynamic. Outdoor: Invasion games (netball) These lessons will continue building skills passing and moving into space, working to create opportunities for shooting. The children will also focus on developing tactics for both attacking and defending and apply these within their teams.		Music: In music, year 5 will learn how to play the guitar. In doing so, holding a guitar correctly, identifying the E string and alternating fingers to play accompanying background soundtrack. 
RE: Humanism Children will explore the non-religious world view of Humanism. As part of this, they will explore the importance of looking after the Earth from the Humanist perspective. 	Computing: Systems This half term, children in Year 5 will be looking at systems, how these work and how search engines find and present search results. 		Art: Sculpture Children will create a self-portrait sculpture (head and shoulders) out of clay inspired by the Anglo-Saxon sculpture ‘Spong Man’. They will use tools to create facial features and show an awareness of where these sit on the face.
