Maths:



Children will be exploring numbers and problems through both concrete (numicon, diennes etc) apparatus and pictorial representations (bar models etc)

Place value, identifying the value of digits in 2-digit numbers. read and write numbers to at least 100, counting in steps of 2 and 5. and across 100.

Addition – Adding numbers, including 2-digit numbers. Recall addition facts to 20.

Multiplication - Recall multiplication facts for x2 x5 x10. Recognise odd and even numbers.

Time - Tell the time to o'clock, half past the hour.

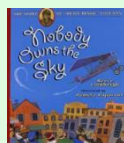
Compare and sequence intervals of time.

English:

Reading – children will have daily guided reading sessions to support their comprehension skills. All children will be given a banded book to bring home to develop these skills further

Phonics – There will be daily phonics lessons and children will be given a book from these sessions to practice and improve their phonics knowledge further.

Writing - We will continue to develop cursive writing. We will be using the text 'Nobody owns the sky' within our written work. Children will be re-telling the story, planning and editing their work. Our writing will focus on adding description to our sentences by using expanded noun phrases. Consolidating the use of full stops and capital letters to demarcate sentences will be a key area for the first part of term. Children will further be encouraged to use coordination in sentences using or, and, but to extend their sentences. We use our history learning to help us to write a non-chronological report all about ourselves.



Science: Animals including humans



Children will develop their understanding of how to keep their bodies healthy. We will look at nutrition and exercise and making healthy food choices. We will investigate the different food groups and use this to help us to create a healthy lunchbox. To help us to understand hygiene and the importance of washing our hands we will be investigating the best way to get rid of germs on our hands!



History: Lives of significant individuals

Children will be exploring the life of footballer Walter Tull and making comparisons to Harry Kane. Children will use a timeline to locate key events to develop their understanding of past and present. We will look at the early experiences of Walter Tull and how he experienced racism within football. We will also explore why Walter Tull is a significant individual to us.



PHSE: Identifying hopes and fears for the year ahead.

We will create a class learning charter and learn how making positive choices has a positive impact on our learning.



Physical Education:

Indoor: Team building: Children will develop their team building skills and use these to complete challenges.

Outdoor: Children will play games that develop their attacking and defensive skills.



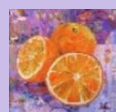
Music To explore the role of football in our society.
