Force for Positive Change



The children will be designing and making their own small frame structure to keep wildlife safe in their habitats. The children will be leaving these structures in the EYFS/KS1 garden for the duration of the winter.



This term, children will develop their understanding of place value, decimals, and measurement.

History / Geography: Benin




This unit provides children with the opportunity to look at a comparative study of Benin, a non-

European society, and their own. The arrival of the Eweka Dynasty in the 12th century is related to the history of Benin together with a broad-based understanding of Africa from earliest times to the present day. The children will investigate and interpret a range of sources including pictures and written accounts, together with oral tradition.

Attendance and Punctuality

- We believe that regular attendance is clearly linked to pupils making good progress in their learning.
- It ensures that pupils settle into school and experience the stability and security they need in order to achieve their best.
- At a minimum we expect children to be in school for 96% of the time. This can still equate to 8 days of learning missed.
- If your child's attendance drops down to below 90%, this means almost 4 weeks of lost learning!
