

Maths



Children will be exploring the following this term:

- Number Place Value
- Number Addition & Subtraction
- Number Multiplication & Division
- Geometry 2D Shapes

Children will continue to develop their problem-solving skills through investigations. English: In English, children will be reading 'Who Let the Gods Out' by Maz Evans. The children will be using this text during their daily reading sessions as well as using this as a stimulus for writing. The

writing genres that the children will be focussing on this term will be: fiction (quest story) and non-fiction: persuasive and formal letter.

Geography

In geography this term, children will compare a region of the UK to a region of Europe Greece. During the topic, they will learn about similarities or differences in human and physical geography of regions, investigate coastal maps and develop an understanding of four figure grid references.

Art: Sculpture

In history, the children will look at influences that the Ancient Greeks had on the Western world including democracy, The Olympics and architecture. The learning will develop their understanding of chronology (BC and BCE), focus on the validity of evidence sources and improve their historical vocabulary through class debates.





PHSE: Being Me, My World

Children will be able to explain why being listened to and listening to others is important in the school community. They will also look at why being



democratic is important to help feel valued. Children will problem-solve and offer different solutions to help their team/ class/ school be more democratic.

In this unit,

Physical Education:

pupils using and applying an understanding of levels and direction to create and perform sequences in groups. Pupils will create their sequences. combining both changes



in level and direction, with balances and using a range of apparatus.

Spanish

In this terms Spanish unit, the children will be looking at vocabualry around exhanging



names, basic greetings, talk about siblings including ages or names, recall information about birthdays and recall numbes upto 31.

inspired Greek Pots, made from clay, depicting

aspects of their life and images of their families.

In this unit, children will listen to a piece of music with intent. They will refine their singing skills, looking at signing as part of an ensemble. During the unit, the children will explore Young Voice songs and finally perform a mashup of two songs.

The children will learn about kosher food choices, look at the story of passover and describe how choices of Jewish people can effect their everyday life choices.






Reading is important. If you know how to read then the whole world opens up to you.

Home learning in Years 3 and 4

Home learning tasks

- Children must bring their book bags every day and change their reading book as and when needed.
- · Weekly Maths or English home learning will be set on our online learning platform.
- Half termly project work will be sent home at the beginning of each half term.
- Home Learning is designed to be enjoyable and each task should not take longer than 30-40 minutes.

DAILY Home learning expectations

Reading

- · Parents are expected to listen to their child read for at least 20 minutes every day.
- Parents are expected to sign in their child's home / school reading record so teachers can see that they have read with their child. Parents can leave comments if they wish.
- Children must make a comment in their home / school reading record based upon reading skills they have been learning about in class.
- Children choose and take home a colour-banded text appropriate to their attainment and they
 can also choose an extra book from the class library if they wish.
- At the start of the year parents will find an information sheet stuck in their child's home / school reading record about how they can help support the development of different reading skills at home.

Spellings

- In the National Curriculum there is a statutory spelling list of 100 words for Years 3 and 4
- Children need to learn to read and spell these in order for them to continue to be an effective reader and writer.
- At the start of the year, a list of these statutory words will be sent home (in the back of the child's reading record) for parents to practise reading and spelling them their child.
- We expect parents to encourage their child to use these words accurately in their writing too.
- · For less confident spellers, we will send home additional spelling related work, lists and / or

resources for individuals who need to catch up.

Home Learning Expectations



Maths

 On a daily basis a child is expected to practise basic number skills in order for them to become fluent and efficient mathematicians.

For example:

- Pairs of numbers to 100 (e.g. 35 + 65 = 100)
- Rapid recall of times table facts and corresponding division facts up to 12 x 12. (e.g. 5 x 7 = 35 and $35 \div 7 = 5$)
- This is essential because by the end of year 4 the Department of Education expect all children to know all multiplication facts to 12 x 12 off by heart.
- · Year 4 children need to sit a national multiplication test.

WEEKLY Home learning expectations

Reading

· Children can also borrow books from our school library during their weekly library slot.

Maths or English

 Tasks will be set via on our online learning platform and children will need to upload their work back onto this site.


HALF TERMLY Home learning expectations







Attendance and Punctuality

- We believe that regular attendance is clearly linked to pupils making good progress in their learning.
- It ensures that pupils settle into school and experience the stability and security they need in order to achieve their best.
- At a minimum we expect children to be in school for 96% of the time. This can still equate to 8 days of learning missed.
- If your child's attendance drops down to below 90%, this means almost 4 weeks of lost learning!
