


Learning Journey: Stones and Bones

Maths Multiplication & Division <p>In maths this term, children will be learning how to multiply two-digit numbers by one digit number using formal written methods. They will solve missing number problems as well as write and calculate mathematical statements. In addition to these, they will be learning about Geometry (3d shapes) and how to add and subtract problems involving money.</p>	English :  <p>This term, children will be writing a mystery story and a non-chronological report based on 'The Great Storm' and stone age era. Some of the grammar skills they will be using include: expanded noun phrases, present tense, adverbials, prepositional phrases and subordination.</p>	History: Stone Age to Iron Age  <p>This term, the children will begin to look at the Stone Age, leading to the Iron Age. They will create a timeline and focus on Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic periods and begin to look at the advancement of tools & inventions over time.</p>	Science: Rocks  <p>This term, the children will explore and compare various types of rocks and their properties by collecting and documenting samples. They will enhance their classification skills by using an identification key to distinguish between different rock types. Additionally, they will also plan and conduct a fair test to determine how fossils are formed.</p>
PHSE: Celebrating Differences <p>Children will learn about families, that they are all different and that sometimes they fall out with each other. The children will also talk about techniques to calm themselves down and discuss a technique called 'solve it together.' The children will also revisit the topic of bullying and talk about being a witness (bystander). They will talk about how a witness has choices and how these choices can affect the bullying that is taking place.</p> 	Physical Education  Outdoor: Invasion Game (NFL) <p>The unit of work will explore how to apply the principles of attack vs defence, with a particular focus on passing and moving to score. Children will develop their understanding of when, where and why they need to create space when they are attacking.</p> Indoor: Gymnastics <p>The focus of the learning is to apply 'excellent gymnastics' when exploring movements and balances in unison. Children will explore creating sequences on the floor using a range of movements and balances that flow.</p>	Art : Stone age painting  <p>The children will use various skills and techniques, such as tone and smudging, to create their own Stone Age-inspired cave paintings.</p> Geography: <p>This term, children will be learning about the 9 regions of the UK, understanding that regions are more than just one country. They will also learn about the human and physical geography of their region, comparing them with other regions.</p>	Mus  <p>Children will listen and discuss a composition. They will play a single accompaniment, develop an improvisation and sing an ensemble.</p> Computing: Computer systems and network  <p>Children will be learning about digital devices, connection and school networks. They will also be learning and creating their own animations.</p> Spanish  <p>This term, children will be able to express how they feel in Spanish, ask others how they are and respond, say their names and numbers from 11-20.</p>
